Field trip reflections from 5th-6th grade Tigers:



Weaving a Biblical Worldview

At Timothy Christian School, we do not believe that spiritual formation happens solely during Bible class and chapel times, but it is integrated and interwoven throughout our curriculum with our schoolwide biblical worldview framework called Teaching for Transformation (TfT).

Teaching for Transformation has identified 10 biblical throughlines to help us invite students to actively contribute to the formation of Christian culture and challenge each student to develop God-honoring traits. These traits help teachers, parents, and students understand what our roles are and what our calling is. Throughlines shift the learning focus away from "what" the students need to know to "who" the students are called to be: God Worshippers, Idolatry-Discerners, Earth Keepers, Beauty Creators, Justice Seekers, Creation Enjoyers, Servant Workers, Community Builders, Image Reflectors, and Order Discoverers.

Believing it is imperative for each students' faith walk to be nurtured through church, home, and school, we at TCS choose to partner with parents in **T**raining for **C**hristian **S**ervice. One way we are doing that this year is by intentionally highlighting the throughlines and how they are being implemented.
