Today's Chapel: Pastor Tom Detamore from the Aplington Baptist Church shared with us about forgiveness today. He shared a story about himself and his son experiencing disappointment and anger that eventually led to forgiveness. At the request of a family friend, they traveled a thousand miles, paid for airline tickets, rented a car, and booked a hotel to be part of a baseball tournament. However, there were too many players, so all the kids played sparingly. Why did we travel all this way? Why did my friend ask my son to play if he already had enough kids? Does he realize how much money I spent? Did my friend know how mad this makes me feel? Pastor Tom shared that he was upset. When Pastor Tom saw his friend many months later, he had a choice to make. He could bring it all back up, or he could put it all aside and forgive him. God intervened that day and gave him the ability to forgive his friend. Even as an adult, it is hard to forgive. But we can. Have that heart of forgiveness for others. God forgives us. We can forgive others who disappoint us. Talk it over, pray about it, and forgive.
